SPECIAL CINEMA EVENT Moving, striking, intriguing and frequently beautiful, Ahlam Shibli's photographs present seldom-seen aspects of an area of global significance. Born in Palestine in 1970, Shibli uses photography to try to understand her own living conditions. Her photographs record moments of daily life for people Running time 4hrs 30mins living in an extra-ordinary situation.

> This exhibition presents two vast groups of photographs that share a focus on the relationship between people and place the very idea of belonging.

'Goter' (2003) comprises over 40 images of Palestinian Bedouin and the places they inhabit in the Negev, the desert region in the south of Israel. Since the 1960s the Bedouin have been forced to leave their traditional lands to live in designated townships. Shibli's photographs record both these 'official' townships and the various 'unrecognised' villages in which many continue to live, in temporary shelters with no services.

'Trackers' is a new work, a series of 85 photographs taken during 2005, similarly concerned with the fate of the Bedouin in contemporary Israel. It focuses on the Palestinians of Bedouin descent who serve in the Israeli army.
