

This pack contains a mix of activities, all designed to extend the film viewing experience when watching our Discovery Shorts: Greatest Hits packages. You'll find activities linked to the following short films, plus general activities that link to character and animation.

We like to link to the three Cs (character, colour, camera) and Ss (story, sound and setting) - we use these with young audiences to help explore key aspects of moving image creation. 
These activity sheets are designed to fit on A4 or A3 for photocopying or downloading at home, and can be done using simple materials.


Zebra

In Julia Ocker's film *Zebra*, we watch the zebra lose their stripes and try out some new patterns. Make a pattern for the zebra below using any materials you like.




Dino Mask

Inspired by Tyrannousaurus Funk, create your own dinosaur mask. Colour in the template below, cut around the dotted lines and ask an adult to help you cut out the eye holes. Once your mask is ready, add a straw with some tape so you can hold it in front of your face.



Dino Feet

Make yourself some dinosaur feet to wear and be inspired by *Tyrannousaurus Funk* to stamp to the beat. Paint, colour, or collage them and then cut out with some help from an adult.



More Dinosaur Fun

Enjoy some more ideas for play using dinosaurs:

• Dip toy dinosaurs in water-based paint and use them to stamp patterns across the page. You can make cleaning up afterwards fun by giving the dinosaurs a bath.



Make a taste-safe sensory tray for wee ones to play with their dinosaurs. Use jelly for volcanoes and try peas and broccoli for the plants. You can feed the peas to the ducks afterwards, it's their favourite food!







Fingerprint Friends

Use your fingers and paint or an ink pad to make fingerprints.

Inspired by the film *Looks*, make some fingerprints together and then turn them into characters by drawing on and around them to make faces and bodies.



Make some characters using the fingerprints below:













Hopfrog


Inspired by the film *Hopfrog*, draw a character below.

Add colour, cut your character out and use straws and tape to make your character into a puppet.








Wombo


In the film *Wombo*, Wombo lands in distress on planet Earth. He is chased by a dog, ends up in a vegetable basket and nearly gets cooked for dinner! Wombo goes through a range of different emotions, pulling lots of different faces throughout his adventures.

Create your own Wombo character and show us how he's feeling. You can use the facial expressions below. Cut them out, colour them and stick them onto the Wombo template. Remember - eyebrows are important!


